Project Description

Transcon personnel perform weekly on-site support for the Regional Environmental Officer and Regional Archeologist. Activities include reviewing and commenting on NEPA documents (environmental reports, assessments, and impact statements), biological assessments and evaluations, cultural resources reports, management plans, stormwater pollution prevention plans, memorandums of agreement and understanding, programmatic agreements, and decision notices. Transcon personnel also provide assistance in tribal consultation, preparation of official correspondence, attendance at meetings and conference call representing BIA staff, assistance in filing and in-house tracking documents, and assistance on consultation activities with various State Historic Preservation Offices. This contract has been extended multiple times.

Transcon has also been asked to provide services for field inventories and reports. We have surveyed and prepared a Class III Cultural Resources Report for several projects in Utah, including the Henderson Ranches Pipeline Right-of-Way.
