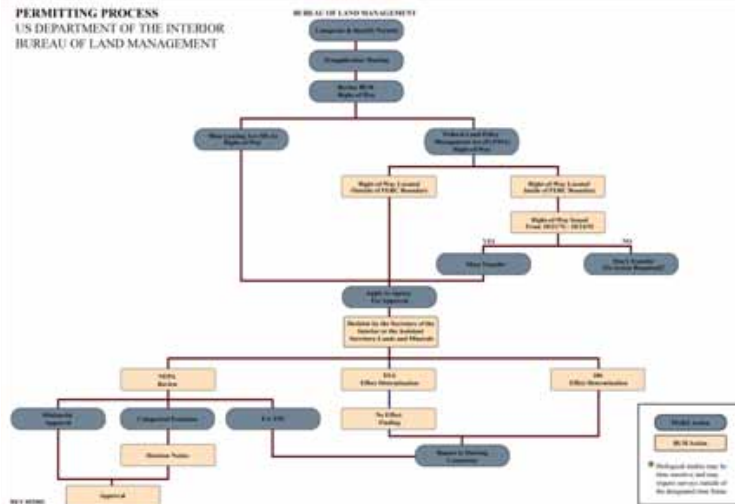


HOLDOVER PERMIT RENEWAL PROJECT

Project Description

The Holdover Permit Renewal project involves the renewal of all expired entitlements with each agency in the Pacific Gas and Electric Company service territory. Specifically, it involves renewals on hundreds of permits, licenses, easements, and right-of-way grants held with agencies around the state. Transcon was responsible for developing the strategy for project implementation, project management, resources investigations, NEPA compliance, 106 compliance, compliance with consent degree for migratory birds and raptors, agency coordination, and field reviews. The project involved working collaboratively with the utility and agencies to develop Maintenance and Operation Plans, Noxious Weed Plans, Vegetation Management Plans, Health and Safety Plans, templates for easements, templates for special use authorizations, and templates for master agreements and leases. The project involved most federal and state land management agencies in California.

The project was awarded a national Professional Achievement Award from the Association of Environmental Professionals in 2006.
